



### Director's statement

As Mstyslav Chernov (20 Days in Mariupol, 2023) said: "I wish I've never made this film".

It was incredibly hard in all senses. But reliving the trauma of occupation and abusive relationships made me stronger. With this film I carry a clear message: The culprit must be punished. It's always the rapist's fault. Stop the Russian war against Ukraine.

## About the director

Anastasiia Falileieva was born in 2000 in Kremenchuk, Ukraine. She studied stop-motion animation and directing at the Kiyv National I.Karpenko-Kary theatre, cinema and television University. Anastasiia is one of a very few stopmotion professionals left in the Ukrainian industry.



# Animation technique

The film is made in a challenging and rare technique of charcoal frame-by-frame animation on paper. I choose this extremely time consuming technique because ashes, burned leftovers and my blurry memory are the only things left after this story. The house in which we were hiding burned down as well as a huge part of Irpin town and other towns and villages occupied by the Russians. Drawing it in charcoal was like reconnecting and reliving the trauma. This medium is very tender and even elusive. One inaccuracy and your line is smudged and destroyed, the drawing disappears. It resonates with the story a lot.



## Animated documentary

Looking back I see the whole story as a metaphor and it is scary to admit it, but I'm grateful that I had such experience. It fundamentally changed me and I hope it will be helpful for other abused women and for people abroad to understand Ukrainian reality. For me this film is a documentary of my past, but unfortunately for thousands of Ukrainians under occupation it is their present.


